- A. Summary information about Altamont Community Unit School District #10
1. Altamont Community Unit School District #10 is a School District located in Altamont, Illinois in Effingham County. The District is organized under the laws of the State of Illinois and provides education for eligible residents in Grades Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup>. The Altamont Community Unit School District will educate the scholastic community, enhance their abilities and transform opportunities into actions. We envision our District as providing an environment where all students are lifelong learners with school, home and community working cooperatively to provide challenging opportunities to learn and grow.

  5. Approximate number of full-time and part-time employees – 120
  6. Although the State has primary authority, the legislature has given responsibility to local school districts for the organization, operation, and financial support of their schools. The Board of Education consisting of seven (7) elected representatives of the local school district, has full authority to operate the public school within the framework of law established by the legislature and interpreted by the Office of the Regional and State Superintendent of Education. There will be no cost when requested records are 50 pages or less. Records exceeding 50 pages will be charged to the requester at 10 cents per paper copy and \$1.00 digital copy.
